#### Dear Parents/Guardians

Dear Parents and Carers, welcome to our August Newsletter. I hope all of you had a lovely break during the summer holidays.

## Vision and values

At the start of each new session it is always important to remind everyone, staff, parents and pupils of the vision for our school. It is important to create, develop and maintain such a vision for the future and I believe that as a school we cannot function unless that vision is shared. A shared vision provides a compass to keep learning on course. A shared vision along with shared values are more important than paper and policies. In order for them to succeed we require teamwork - that is the ability to work together toward a common vision.

Our vision for this session is simple:

In St Athanasius' Primary we need all of our children to be nurtured, safe, active, healthy, achieving, included, respected and responsible...to be the best they can be with a can do attitude. To be challenged everyday and have their achievements recognised, valued and celebrated.

I hope this vision is one which we all share. There is an old proverb which sums this up:

"Coming together is a beginning. Keeping together is progress. Working together is success!"

#### Classes and staffing.

Mrs Callan as Principal Teacher has 2 days management out of class. This is covered by Miss Smalls

# Promoting Positive Behaviour/ House System.

As part of auditing practice and in discussion with staff, parent council and pupils, it has been necessary to redraft elements of our Behaviour Policy and some of the approaches used. All children need continuous, positive reinforcement to thrive. In order for them to learn to make good decisions, children can benefit from reward-based schemes that also include some form of deterrent for not so good behaviour. Here at St Athanasius' Primary, as in many other schools throughout Scotland and the UK, we use The Circle Time, Golden Rules approach. Golden Time schemes, when implemented effectively, provide teachers with increased positive behaviour in the classroom setting. Less time spent shouting or scrambling to respond to bad behaviour ultimately means more time for learning and positive social and emotional development for children. By providing even very young children with a clear list of Golden Rules, and clear rewards for good behaviour, along with defined consequences for failing to follow the rules, you can effectively address the social and emotional development needs that lead to poor behaviour .Children respond to positive behaviour incentives. When it comes to social and

emotional learning, using such incentives is an excellent way to achieve results, according to child behaviour specialists. The key to Golden Time is providing a clear structure for penalties as well as rewards. As a behavioural tool, Golden Time works by encouraging children to control their actions by understanding the consequences of their choices. To encourage this step in development, clear signals must be provided as a child progresses toward losing some of their Golden Time. For example in our school the rules are clear...a verbal warning, followed by a yellow card... followed by a red card. This means loss of 5 minutes Golden Time. This can be won back if the child over the course of the week improves. Every week every child starts with 30 minutes Golden Time. Copies of the Golden Rules are available on request. If you have been a regular attendee at our OSCARS Assembly, you will have noticed that one house has been dominating every month. Since its inception 4 years ago, our roll has decreased and there is an imbalance in the houses. I have therefore re allocated children into houses to ensure that each house has the same number of children. All siblings are in the same house. I hope your child is not too disappointed if they have been moved, but I have to be fair to all children. The House Captain elections will take place soon. Mr Desport will use the Democracy Topic as a backdrop.

#### **OSCARS**

Feedback from parents regarding the OSCARS is favourable but many cannot manage to attend I have decided to keep the OSCARS but it is not necessary to have them on a Friday afternoon. The OSCARS

Assembly dates will vary. Parents will be invited to some but not all. I will publish the times and dates of assemblies to which parents are invited. Celebrating success both in and out of school is vitally important.

Recently a school in Glasgow won the Prestigious Education Awards for their innovative assemblies...called the OSCARS.. They only started it one year ago!!!!

#### **Behaviour contract**

You will receive a copy of our behaviour contract. Please read it over with your child(ren). This contract is to support the school's teaching and learning and behaviour management policy.

These rules are here to support our learning together. Our school rules are fair and help everyone here to reach their potential. I have discussed these rules as a staff and with the

Parent and Pupils Council.
All children and parents to sign and return this. It sets out the school's expectations in language that all children can understand. By signing it, children will show their commitment to good behaviour within school. Children who consistently misbehave or don't follow the class or school rules will be excluded from excursions etc...

#### **School Improvement Plan**

I have arranged for P2 – 7 to have a taster of lunch time clubs. This will happen each Wednesday over the next few weeks. Each class will have ONE session. #### **After school Clubs**

## **Support for Learning**

As I indicated earlier, our staffing levels are at the minimum this session. Therefore, I have re arranged the Support for our Learners within the school. Mrs Crawford and Mrs Crockett will in their capacity as Classroom Support Assistants, support the learning of children under the direction of the class teacher. Mrs Crockett will support P4 – 7 and Mrs Crawford will support P1- 3.

I will support the learning of Primaries 4 - 7. My focus initially will be Literacy.

#### **Golden Time**

The Golden time activities will continue in their present format for P1 - 3. However, we are

considering a new approach for P4 - 7 which may involve an activity afternoon on a Friday. This could be a craft club, a basketball club, music, board games, knitting, ICT or whatever. Each child would sign up for an activity for about 6 - 8 weeks and then rotate. I am looking for parents or grandparents who can use their talents on a weekly basis. ## **Christmas Concert**

This year our Christmas Concert will be a simple Nativity
Production. We have not decided yet what classes will do, but whatever, we will keep rehearsals to an absolute minimum to ensure that the core curriculum is not disrupted. I am aware some parents were bemused at the time taken to rehearse for the Wizard of Oz. Although a high quality production which highlighted a wide variety of talent in our school, the issue of rehearsal time was raised.

The Infant Department will decide the type of Christmas Presentation to perform, whilst P4 – 7 will perform a different one.

Although music and drama is an area of expertise for me, it is time to allow other staff to utilise their talents.

I have pencilled in Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> December for our Concert. I have not decided yet whether to have an evening performance. If we don't have one there will be an additional show on Wednesday afternoon of 14<sup>th</sup> December.
